COMICS INTERVIEW #31

Dark Knight Returns cover by Frank Miller



In 1986 Frank Miller permanently raised the bar for comic book storytelling with his groundbreaking Dark Knight Returns series, breaking down limitations of what was previously thought possible and creating a thoroughly modern take on Batman that would have a lasting impact on the industry. The fourissue series would become one of the most popular titles ever and is still making an impression on new generations of readers every day.

The cover for Comics Interview #31, published by the late David Anthony Kraft, was one of a small number of promotional pieces Miller did in the lead-up to the series. Arriving three months before Dark Knight Returns #1, it represents the very first cover appearance of Miller's version of Batman and Carrie Kelly as Robin. The piece is classic Miller, showing a grimacing Batman who exhibits signs of age and world-weariness, along with an exuberant Robin displaying all the enthusiasm of youth. The Dynamic Duo burst across the cover from left to right, reminiscent of what might be the most highly regarded page from the series. In this image, which is both penciled and inked by Miller, the drama is ramped up by the addition of stark shadows, which brings to mind the highly stylized Sin City, rather than the more refined Dark Knight.

This opportunity to own the very first cover art from one of the most important comics ever published cannot be understated, and may not come again for a very long time.

COMICS INTERVIEW #2

Ronin cover by Frank Miller



Following his career-making turn illustrating Daredevil, which saw a third-string Marvel title catapult into the upper echelons of comic sales in the Bronze Age, Frank Miller was looking to do something new and unique. Leaving Marvel for the more creatively free environs of DC, Miller would create one of his signature works in the stunning Ronin, a six-issue mini-series that tells the tale of a samurai displaced from feudal Japan to a distant dystopian future.

Miller's work on Ronin marked a noticeable change in artistic style, one he would employ only for this brief moment in time. The influence of Japanese Manga, along with European science-fiction bande dessinée, mixed in with his own, already distinctive, style gave rise to something truly unique. This cover, from Comics Interview #2, was published in April of 1983 predating Ronin #1, which would not come out until July of the same year, making it the debut cover appearance of Ronin. Like the Dark Knight cover that accompanies it in this auction, the piece originates from David Anthony Kraft's personal collection and is being offered on behalf of his widow.


Artwork from Ronin is exceptionally rare, not a single cover from the series has sold publicly, and the interior pages are also in very short supply. This is a unique opportunity to bid on a cover from Miller's first original creation.


SON OF ORIGINS OF MARVEL COMICS

Cover by John Romita Sr.

1975's Son of Origins was Simon & Schuster's follow-up to the successful compendium, Origins of Marvel Comics, featuring more classic reprints that focused on a deeper collection of characters.

The original cover was painted by Marvel mainstay John Romita Sr., who took to the task admirably, providing the book with appropriately iconic imagery. Because of the limitations of printing processes of the time, painted covers could not be properly reproduced in comics, so, for the purposes of advertising, this version of the cover was created by Romita in traditional pen and ink. The piece features beautiful depictions of many classic Silver Age Marvel heroes.





FANTASTIC FOUR #126

Cover by John Buscema

In 1972, a couple of years after Jack Kirby's departure from the Fantastic Four, the important responsibility of illustrating the title would be entrusted to the capable hands of John Buscema, whose considerable talents would shine during his time with Marvel's first family.

What makes this piece so special is it's the first time FF #1 was referenced as the inspiration for another comic's cover, one which shows the Fantastic Four doing battle with the fearsome creature Giganto. Buscema modernizes the iconic image while retaining the classic composition and energy of Kirby's original. This cover is one of the strongest from Buscema's tenure on the FF and would certainly be one of the crown jewels of any comic art portfolio.

LOVE AND ROCKETS #2 & #3

We're thrilled to be able to offer two rare and significant pieces from the early days of the Hernandez Brothers' cult sensation, Love & Rockets. First up is the iconic title page to part one of the seminal "Mechanics" story from L&R #2, which initiates the romance between Maggie Chascarrillo and Hopey Glass, an ongoing yarn that is still being spun forty years hence.

From issue #3 comes the beautiful, complete, eponymously titled, two-page story of an unidentified woman whose love for Atoma (the superhero identity of series regular Penny Century) has driven her to suicidal desperation, only to be rescued at the last minute by the object of her affections.



Created by Jerry Siegel and Joe Shuster in 1938, the Man of Steel became an instant icon to Depression-era readers and transformed into a symbol of national spirit and spunk during the brutal days of WWII. Since then, Superman has endured as both a beloved character and an embodiment of hope and vigor, making this first appearance not only a treasured piece of comics history but of American history as well.

This milestone has also proven to be the success story of comics investment, growing rapidly and unstoppably in value. With the MCU machine churning out a multiverse of Spidey blockbusters, copies of Spider-Man's first appearance have become one of the few completely bulletproof investments in recent times. This important book would be the enviable centerpiece of any collection or investment portfolio.



INCREDIBLE HULK #1

Inspired by Jekyll & Hyde and the myth of the Golem, Stan Lee and Jack Kirby kept their Silver Age hot streak running with the big and brutal Hulk. This issue prevs on Cold War fears of nuclear annihilation and the average teenage boy's bodily discomfort to create one of the most haunting and affecting of hero origins. Initially gray in his premiere appearance, the character was quickly reworked into a big green beast when the primitive four-color printing process mangled the color scheme throughout the book, altering the Goliath's look from page to page. The classic cover image still resonates with fans to this day. A major Silver Age key like this only becomes rarer and more desirable over time.

X-MEN #1

Stan Lee once explained that his original title for this series was "The Mutants" but Marvel publisher Martin Goodman didn't like the sound of it. Lee, in a stroke of genius, named the newly formed group after its founder, Professor X, and thus the X-Men were born. They were a motley band of outcasts, hated and feared by the human world. Everybody can relate to what it is like being an outsider, and that is what draws us to the X-Men. Thanks to a staggering number of comic spin-offs, blockbuster movies, and a variety of TV shows and cartoons, this first issue has proven to be a strong and consistent investment in the marketplace.


PUNCH COMICS #12



Punch Comics was created by the self-aggrandizing comic-book showman Harry "A." Chesler Jr. and the title would find itself stirring up a bit of controversy in the pre-code era, mainly due to a variety of scandalous covers. The aptly titled series often boasted hard-hitting and aggressive cover art such as this gunfight-in-a-skull classic; a hard-boiled book from a hard-boiled time. According to Mr. Chesler himself, this issue is one of the "World's Greatest Comics" and who would argue with that? A powerful image set against a foreboding, black background, we consider this to be one of the true classic covers of pre-code adventure comics. This particular copy, from the esteemed Jon Berk Collection, is sure to be a hit with Golden Age collectors.
