RUSS MANNING STAR WARS SUNDAY STRIPS



The Star Wars newspaper strip launched in 1979, and master draftsman Russ Manning proved up to the task of expanding on the sci-fi world envisioned in George Lucas' wildly successful blockbuster. Manning only worked on the project until mid-1980 when his declining health forced him to leave. This group of Sundays contains some of the best work Manning created during his tenure on Star Wars, beginning with one of the try-out pages he presented to convince the publishers he was right for the job. Next is a Sunday from March 1979, a masterclass in design that features everything a true fan could want in a Star Wars page, Star Destroyers, droids, explosions, and even a bit of the classic opening scroll from the film. Following that is an entry from September '79 that presents Obi-Wan Kenobi's only appearance in the Sundays. Finally, and most significantly, is the page from June 22nd, 1980: This piece features the very first Sunday appearance of Boba Fett (he was briefly in two previous dailies) and was published mere weeks after "The Empire Strikes Back" debuted in theaters. Each of these lots represents an important piece of Star Wars history and would make a fine addition to the collection of any comic art aficionado or sci-fi superfan.


CAPTAIN AMERICA COMICS #1



We've said it before, but it bears repeating that the popularity of characters such as Captain America and the willingness of comic writers and artists to confront the Axis threat went a long way toward mobilizing a heretofore isolationist American populace in the long, dark days of the late 30s and early 40s. The almost entirely US-based comics business, staffed and developed largely by fugitives from those same wartime horrors, boldly waved the flag of freedom, most notably in this instant classic. In those pre-Pearl Harbor days, the Hitler hammering cover image was simply incendiary, and copies flew off shelves almost immediately, leading to the First Avenger's decades-long run as the preeminent symbol of American heroism.


CRIME SUSPENSTORIES #22



Crime SuspenStories #22 may very well be the most notorious comic book in the history of the medium, placed front and center in Sen. Estes Kefauver's high-profile grilling of EC publisher William Gaines, this issue was likely the straw that broke the camel's back, led to the publication of Fredrick Wertham's "Seduction of the Innocent," and, ultimately, the formation of the Comics Code Authority. It is plain to see how this disturbing imagery became the scapegoat for the squeaky-clean sheen that whitewashed the USA in the idyllic 1950s. As most people understand today, that air of perfection was glossing over some of the more troubling aspects of American society, and to blame growing amorality and violence on comic books seems rather short-sighted in the modern-day. The historical importance of this issue is reflected in the impressive amounts copies continue to sell for at auction.

Dr. Doom, according to Jack Kirby, was modeled after the Middle Ages' concept of Death, hence the skull-like mask and hood. Kirby claimed that Doom, a genius inventor, sorcerer, and leader of the fictional country of Latveria, is inherently evil, and as a result of his facial disfigurement and hatred for Reed Richards, he lashes out against the world in perpetual vengeance. He is one of comics' greatest and most complex villains ever created and he makes his debut here in Fantastic Four #5. Created by the team of Kirby and Stan Lee, Dr. Doom has been copied and imitated many times over the last 50 years, most notably as one of Lucasfilm's inspirations in creating Darth Vader.



MAD #1



American humor of the past seven decades owes its existence and style largely to this unassuming little raised middle finger of a comic. It was a nearly instant smash hit, inspiring dozens of often dreadful imitators, and eventually morphed into a black and white magazine that became even more influential and world-famous throughout the 1960s and '70s. It was originally this full-color blast of sick humor that was a nuclear explosion going off in the minds of impressionable young readers and hip comedy mavens. The result influenced everyone from Lenny Bruce to George Carlin to Ernie Kovacs to the Smothers Brothers, and beyond. It's hard to overstate the importance this first issue of Mad exerted on American popular culture.



VENUS #19



Bill Everett brought the pre-code Venus series to a close with a trio of horror covers culminating in his pièce de résistance, Venus #19, where our titular heroine comes face to face with death on one of the most revered horror covers ever created. As a trio of ghouls floats ominously in the background, a handsome young man peels back his skin to reveal his true self, a living skeleton insisting on a kiss from the brassy blonde protagonist. This cover is undeniably one of the most striking and beloved of the era. While the true market value of this comic has yet to be realized, this blue-chip classic has done nothing but gain in value over the years.

SENSATION COMICS #1

Sensation Comics #1 is not the first appearance of Wonder Woman, but it's the most famous WW issue around, and it presents her first cover appearance as well -- an undeniably big moment in comics history. William Moulton Marston's revolutionary and caaily subversive heroine exploded onto the Golden Age comics scene, thereby officially establishing the "trinity" of DC's hero stable, and promoting a role model and avatar for millions of fans all over the world. With James Gunn's recent hiring as the head of DC's movie department, the Amazonian Princess is slated for a reboot, which will certainly raise the value of this milestone issue once again.

TALES TO ASTONISH #44

Tales to Astonish #44 introduces one of the most prominent heroines in Marvel Comics, Janet Van Dyne aka The Wasp. At first, Van Dyne appeared as a partner to Hank Pym's Ant-Man, on a crusade to avenge her father's death, but later she would become Pym's love interest and superpowered counterpart. Wasp is most notable for being a founding member of The Avengers, giving the team their name, and serving as their longest active affiliate. Tales to Astonish #44 is a hot book for investment collectors with "Ant-Man and the Wasp: Quantumania" about to hit theaters to initiate Phase Five of the MCU.

WHIZ COMICS #2(#1)



It's hard to imagine now, but for about a decade, Superman's most fearsome nemesis was not Lex Luthor or the Toyman, but the Big Red Cheese, Captain Marvel. The "Shazam!" protagonist enjoyed colossal popularity and mammoth sales that eclipsed even the Man of Steel's impressive success as he moved as many as five million copies per issue in the Golden Age. This moody, mysterious origin tale, with its unfathomable caves, ancient gods, and atmospheric visuals set this series apart from all others of the day. Rich and detailed, instantly appealing, and perfectly tailored to its troubled times, Fawcett's family of Marvels remains a literary triumph, a comics cornerstone, as well as a modern-day cinematic sensation.
